

# **Introducing RPFC**

Research promotion facilitation centre (RPFC) in the Faculty of Medicine, University of Colombo was established in 2013, with funding provided via the World Bank grant – Higher Education for Twenty first Century (HETC). The initial objective was to promote and support research activities in the Faculty including the PhD projects funded by the HETC



grant. Since 2013, RPFC has contributed significantly to uplift and promote a positive research culture in the Faculty and also has established research networks with local and international research institutes.

The RPFC has expanded since then and recently was formalized as an administrative unit with spacious infrastructure and support provided by the Faculty. The current unit has several objectives provided via seven main arms with each arm coordinated by an activity coordinator and supervised and guided by an advisor.

Following are the current functions of the RPFC categorized under each activity.

#### 1. Conducting research training programmes

- Conducting research training workshops to post-graduate students, academic staff and supervisors of the Faculty of Medicine
- Conducting research training workshops to academic staff and research supervisors of the networking faculties and institutes
- RPFC will commence a certificate course in postgraduate research from 2018

#### 2. Conducting Research writing support programme (RWSP)

- Conducting the RWSP for the post-graduate students, academic staff and supervisors of the Faculty of Medicine
- Provision of editorial support to the authors mentored via the RWSP
- Provision of access to the RWSP to academic staff and research supervisors of the networking faculties and institutes
- Support networking faculties and institutions to initiate and conduct RWSPs



# 3. Facilitating recruitment of students, progress review and mentoring for post-graduate research students and supervisors in the Faculty of Medicine, Colombo

Facilitate recruitment of post-graduate students

- Regular progress review of the post-graduate research projects (especially the ones facilitated by the RPFC) by the advisory committee.
- Provision of counseling and problem solving sessions with experts in the area of research for both research students and supervisors.
- Provision of guidance and support to the academic staff, in all the areas related to research
- Regular assessments/surveys of research support needs of the post-graduate students and supervisors
- Improving generic skills of the researchers through regular journal clubs.



#### 4. Provision of core research facilities for research

- Carrying out a research instrument lending service
- Providing video conferencing and library facilities
- Supporting establishment of research laboratories and collaboration between laboratories for research

#### 5. Providing platforms to publicize research in the Faculty of Medicine, Colombo

- Conducting research forums to publicize research done in different departments
- Support organising committee of the annual research symposium of the Faculty
- Develop Audio-visual and other materials to publicize research

# 6. Facilitating research collaborations with national and international research institutions, industry and policy makers



- Supporting research collaborations, establish MOUs and monitor progress of the collaborations of the Faculty of Medicine, Colombo
- Facilitating the process of reviewing and approval of research contracts
- Facilitating and supporting meetings and processes with policy makers

#### 7. Facilitation of technology transfer

- Technology Transfer Office (TTO) of the RPFC is expected to be the faculty contact point of the IP Hub project of the National Intellectual Property Office (NIPO).
- Support intellectual property issues and patent filing
- Promote commercialization of research

Furthermore, RPFC provides administrative, infrastructure and clerical support to the research and higher degrees committee (RHDC) and the research committee (RC) of the Faculty aligning with the master plan of the faculty. RPFC has recently established a clinical trials committee (CTC) chaired by Prof. Priyadharshani Galappaththy of the Department of Pharmacology to support clinical trials of the Faculty.

## Research Writing Support Program (RWSP)

The RPFC has commenced the first formalized research writing support programme in the country with the support from INASP, UK through the AuthorAID programme. The research writing support activities commenced as training workshops in 2013 and expanded into the RWSP which consists of training workshops, an online course and writing clubs. Writing support is provided by a dedicated group of mentors- current and retired members of the Faculty of medicine, to the mentees to write and publish their research articles in peer-reviewed high quality indexed journals. The programme runs once year for three to four months. The fourth RWSP of the RPFC commenced in December 2017 and concluded in April 2018. Next RWSP will commence in January 2018.

The centre is providing expertise and support to the networking partners to initiate writing support programmes in their institutions. Peradeniya and Ragama Medical Faculties successfully initiated

the writing support programmes and recently RPFC supported the National Science Foundation to commence their writing support activity.

The Author Aid Global Partners meeting was successfully held in the Faculty of Medicine, Colombo, Sri Lanka in December 2017, hosted by the RPFC and was attended by representatives from networking partners of RWSP, international researchers and organisations contributing to Author AID and

The RWSP was highly commended by the participants and some international participants planned to commence RWSPs similar to that of RPFC in their institutions.

## Certificate Course in Postgraduate Research

#### Dr. Shreenika Weliange, MBBS, Msc, MD

The research training arm of the RPFC will commence a certificate course for post-graduate researchers in the country to equip them with the research skills required to carry out a high quality post-graduate research project. The course consists of four modules. Each module is of one-month duration with two full days of face to face learning at the beginning of the module followed by online tutor guided teaching learning activities.

Areas covered by each module are given below.

#### **MODULE 1- Preparing for higher degree research and ethics**

- Introduction to postgraduate research
- Selecting a research area and planning a research a project
- Rules and regulations of Research and Higher Degrees Committees
- Selection of supervisors
- Managing supervisor trainee relationships
- Introduction to collaborative research
- Library skills introduction to literature search, Facilities available in the library for researchers
- General skills interpersonal relationships, teamwork, communication, Information
   Technology
- Overview of ethics in research human and animal
- Application for ethical approval from a recognized Ethics committee
